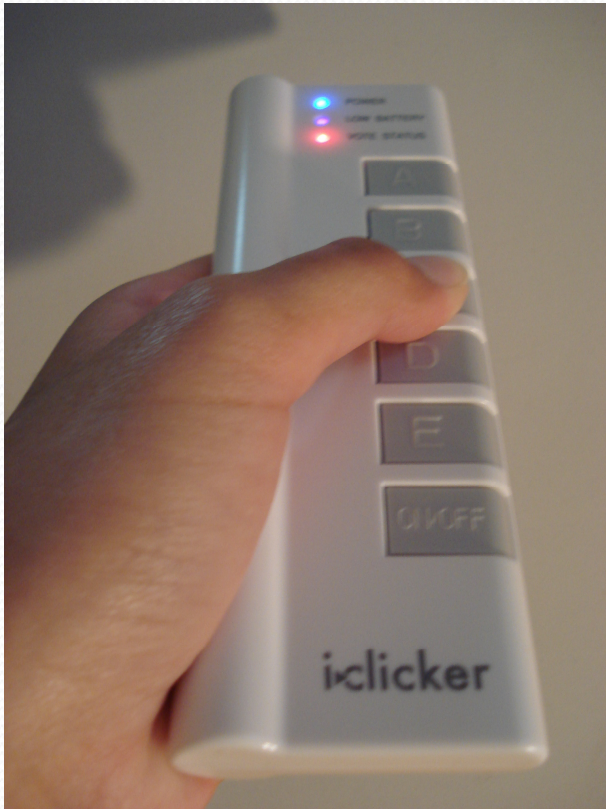

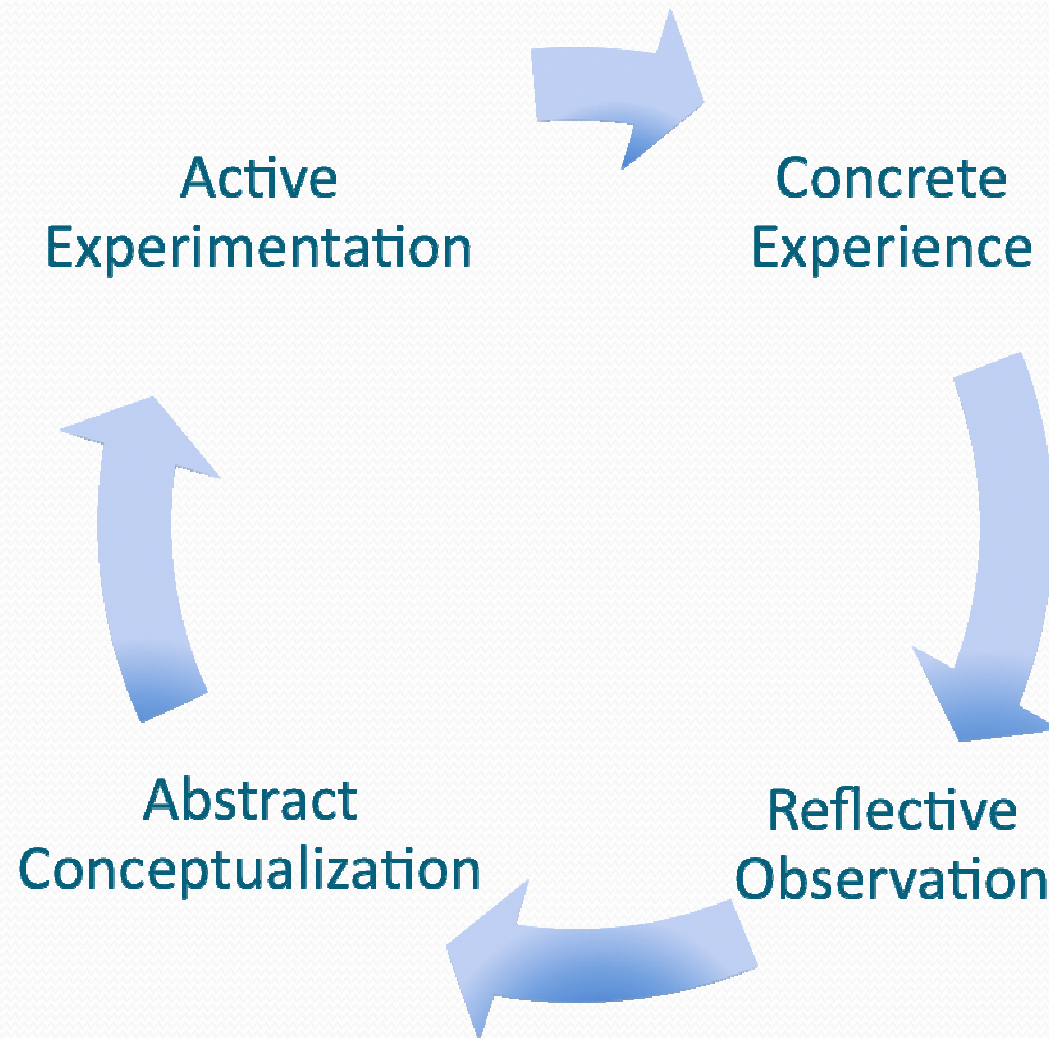

# Voice over Internet Protocol: making theory relevant

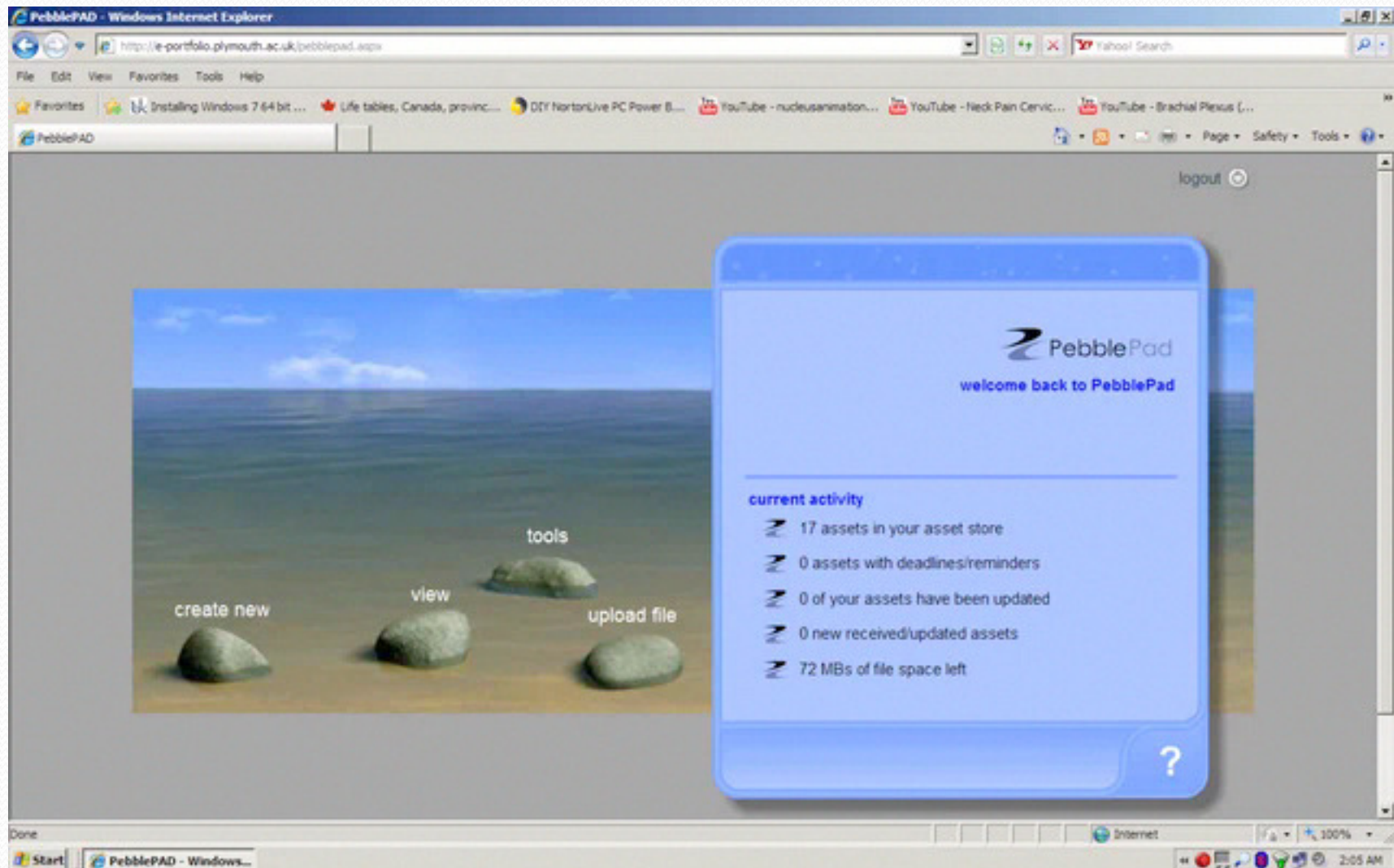
- Guest speakers and experts –

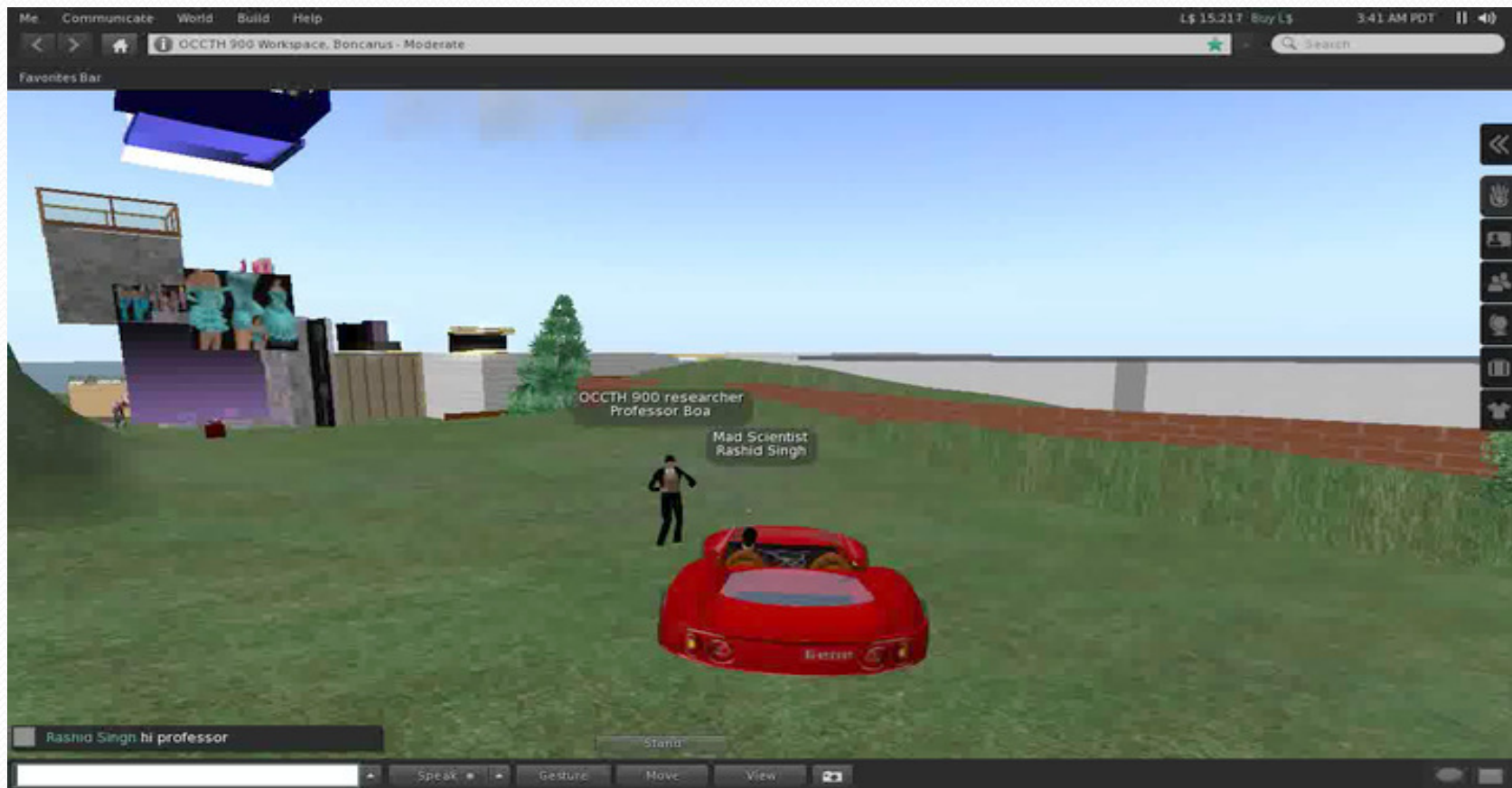

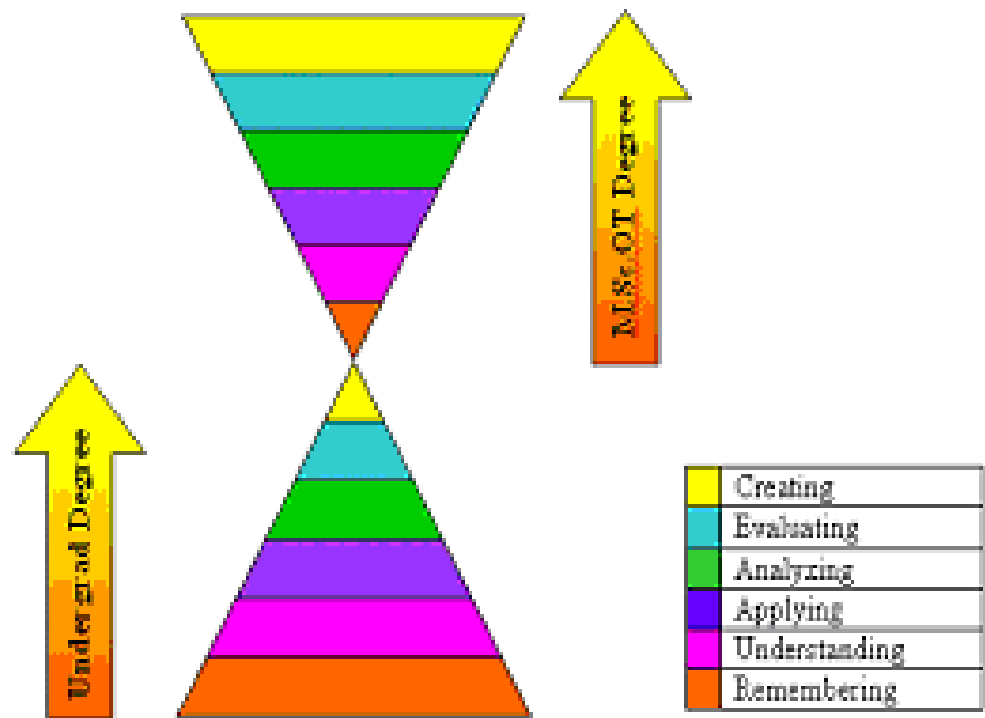


